Program Activities categorized and described Theme wise as:

Theme I. CHILD RIGHTS (EDUCATION)

Project- Yuvaah Pahal Supported by UNICEF

Project Objective:

Strengthening adolescent and youth group to play an active role in prevention of child marriage, violence against children and strengthening of Yuvaah initiatives 12 college in 6 Districts, including Tonk, Bundi, Kota, Ajmer, Jodhpur and Jaisalmer in state of Rajasthan” (**Yuvaah Pahal**)

Key outcomes/achievement:

Capacity Building Workshop with NSS, NCC, Scouts and Guide- 2352 Youth from all 06 District (Tonk, Bundi, Kota, Ajmer, Jodhpur and Jaisalmer) from various organizations, such as NSS (National Service Scheme), Scouts and Guide, NCC and other community youth members Child Rights and Protection, including issues such as Child Marriage, Violence against children and POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences), Child Labour, Cyber Crime and Gender bias discrimination and identities.



Adolescent/Youth Groups - The formation of Adolescent/Youth Groups in 15 panchayats within the Tonk District. 900 Adolescents/youth in 30 groups formed, consisting of 15 boys' groups and 15 girls' groups and regular meeting are taking place with them on Child protection, Child marriage and life skills.

Formed PLCPCs with 300 PRI members in 15 panchayats of Tonk District, focusing on child protection, child marriage prevention, and linking deprived children to social security schemes. A Block Level Child Protection Committee (BLCPC) was also established with 50 participants trained on child protection roles and responsibilities

A 'Youth Excellence Centre' has been established in Kathmana village, Tonk district, to provide career counselling and support for mental health issues. 169 Youth participate in this year for career counselling and open library services self-study point with internet and air-condition facility at rural.

Awareness Campaign (May 6–13) on Akha Teej: An 8-day vehicle rally covered 47 villages, engaging communities with support from the Child Rights and Women’s Empowerment Departments, DLSA, and local leaders. Activities included street discussions, pamphlet distribution, and religious leader involvement to raise awareness on the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, and promote age-



appropriate marriage and education schemes. The campaign prevented 4 child marriages and empowered 25 girls to continue their education.

Special Day celebration with 560 youths through the year:

- Aug 12: International Youth Day celebrated in Sohela, Devpura, Bagadi panchayats, and Youth Excellence Centre Kathmana with school and library youth, focusing on empowerment and education.
- Nov 14–20: Children’s Day Week held across 8 panchayats with creative and educational activities promoting teamwork and self-expression.
- Dec 9–10: As part of the 16-day GBV campaign, meetings and oath-taking events held in Bagdi, Devpura, and Soran to raise voices against violence.
- Jan 8–12: Five-day Youth Festival organized; SSSR and UNICEF set up an info stall on past initiatives and Yuva Saathi Kendra program.
- Jan 23: National Girl Child Day celebrated with adolescents at GP Arniyakedar.



Media Workshop : A workshop involving 30 media professionals was organized to discuss the role and responsibility of the media in preventing child marriage. Media may be supporting to community for knowledge and awareness through the media print/social media platform. Shared the project objective and activity brief to participant and discuss on how they will be support to community in this program by her/him contribution in adolescent, youth and children development issue.

Mental Health Session with 1048 Collage youth by Expert:

A mental health session conducted across 12 colleges 1048 participants in 06 Districts, with active participation from NSS volunteers. The session covered mental health concepts, determinants, and stress management strategies, facilitated by resource persons. Participants gained valuable insights into mental well-being, and their engagement highlighted increased awareness and involvement.



Project 2 - Youth Led Action for Inclusive Education and Access to SRHR - Empower US

Project - “Youth Led Action for Inclusive Education and Access to Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights” with financial support from Empower in 15 villages of 4 GP in Piploo Block, Tonk District, Rajasthan.

Objectives:

- By August 2024, 300 young people will be able to make their own decisions for career development opportunities, leadership and skills.
- By November 2024, 300 adolescent girls and 75 boys (young people) will have knowledge about sexual reproductive health and rights (SRHR) and access to services - free from coercion, discrimination and violence and preventive health care.

Key Achievements:

Formation Quarterly Meeting with Youth Advisory Council: A meeting with the girls/women associated with the initial intervention of projects area. The intention expressed to form a youth advisory council and to cooperate in the creation, evaluation and implementation of project related to children. Development the guideline with mutual participation and by selecting the members as per the guideline, a group of 15 girl members of the youth advisory council formed. quarterly meeting, Sharing the progress of the work done under the project, discussion & expressed its suggestions and feedback, health check-up report share with the administration & communicate to activate the child marriage task force.



Capacity building training of Youth Council on

building understanding on project related issues and cooperation in better implementation of the project: On 9 June 2024, a one-day training of 15 members of the Youth Advisory Council organized. In the training, a comprehensive understanding on the Youth Advisory Council Guidelines, Nomination of member in designation: President, Vice President, Secretary and Deputy Secretary in the Youth Advisory Council determined and the names of the persons proposed for the posts unanimously.

Digital literacy Module development for Cascade training: A module on digital literacy consisting of five sessions by the resource person on definition and need of digital literacy, use of social media platforms, risks and precautions, online searching/search engines, cyber-crime and prevention measures. Knowledge building on making profile & document As CV/resume and online application for jobs.

TOT of youth leader on Digital Literacy: Training on digital literacy on dated 9-10, November 2024 with 25 (20 girls & 5 Boys) youth. Digital literacy, use of social media platforms, cyber-crime, access to safe and correct information on search engines, finding jobs on online platforms, the process of making one's own CV and resume and the application process. The youth shared some examples related to cyber-crime where their family members or any of their close relatives have been victims of crime. The youth expressed their commitment to alert their family, village and



relatives while being alert themselves. Trained as master trainers & Developed a plan to conduct sessions in schools children of class 9-11th on digital literacy by 2 trainers each.

Digital literacy training of higher school education 9-12th at school: After being trained in digital literacy training, four young interns provided special sessions about digital literacy. The young interns organized sessions in schools on Dated 7-14th December 2024 with 238 Adolescent girls and boys to create awareness about digital literacy and gave the message to be alert. Along with this, the project team provided information by organizing a special session on digital literacy with 195 girls and 55 boys in 19 adolescent Girls and 4 adolescent Boys groups.

Feasibility study: Feasibility study for identification of Non-Traditional Livelihood option for skill training. The study conducted with 104 girls & 20 Boys, Based on the findings/conclusion of study: Interest of youth in computer, beauty parlor courses, acupressure therapy course, veterinary course in Sheep Research Centre Malpura. Discussion with Youth Council member Considering computer course as an essential skill and deciding to train the youth on it.



Module Development on research findings: Based on the findings of the feasibility study and sharing the finding with youth council member in quarterly meeting final the module on digital computer literacy skill training for basic knowledge and certification 45 days courses.

Stipends for 4 Youth interns: In this intervention youth centric approaches successful learning us, internship support to youth as a trainer on digital literacy courses. (member of youth advisory council) Vasundhara Prajapat, Rinku Saini, Nisha Harijan and Narangi Prajapat conducted sessions with children of class 9 and 11 in Government Higher Secondary School. and also support to girls for essential skill of the 21st century RSCIT certification course for 27 girls received Stipend support.

03-day residential training of 50 discussion leaders on life skills education and SRHR: Life skill session -self-confidence and self-respect, emotion management, empathy and respect, effective communication, gender challenges and child marriage. SRHR issue: like-changes in adolescence, hygiene and health related to menstruation, motherhood in adolescence, safe and responsible behavior, preventing infection and removing misconceptions

Mentoring Session support Discussion Leader for life skill education & SRHR Session: After the discussion leader training, the project team provided mentoring support to the discussion leader for planning and providing support material for conducting group sessions. Support to leader for preparing a session plan and material.

Adolescent health checkup: collaborate with Government Health department on HB, BMI with counseling especially mental health session in 04 Senior schools. Written order to respective Depart. HB, height and weight – BMI, BP 402 adolescent girls checked. Results of checkup event in adolescents- HB 49% have 6-9gm & HB 48.51% 9-12gm, body mass index- 50.74% underweight and 2.23 were overweight. Similarly, 23 girls had high blood pressure and 59 had low blood pressure.

Interface/conversation on child marriage prevention strategy at block level between Block child marriage Task force (BPTF) and Adolescent girls: On 29 November 2024, a 25-member of adolescent girls group along with the Youth Advisory Council members a dialogue with the block



level task force members & interacted with the SDM, Tehsildar, BDO in Piploo. The Girls learned about the efforts being made to prevent child marriage and talked about honoring and providing security to the girls on the prevention of child marriage.

Advisory council member interface with DM/SDM: On 14 October 2024, 16 Youth Advisory Council members presented an application of 9 demands charter to the Chief Executive Officer on the basis of the findings of the adolescent health checkup, services in the district for the nutrition of adolescent girls, getting health checkup, quality supply of sanitary pads, facility road lights at the Panchayat headquarters, drinking water system, appointing physical teachers in the school etc. The Chief Executive, after receiving the letter, sent it to the higher officials and talked about acting.

Social Media Campaign Through online material development and sharing: A WhatsApp group of Youth Advisory Council members and adolescent girls has been created. Sharing the digital messages on child marriage, sexual and reproductive health, menstrual management, Safe use of mobile are being created and circulated in the group so that adolescent girls can become aware and empowered and move towards development while protecting themselves.

Dissemination workshop- The workshop on dated 28 March for sharing the learnings and progress, key achievements, Success case story by Youth Advisory Council members, discussion leaders, PLCPC (Protection committee) members and share the future strategy, final evaluation report to the participants and shared its main findings.

Activity 11- Monitoring, learning and evaluation- By youth advisory: The final evaluation by five girls of the Youth Advisory Council. The process of Evaluation questionnaire prepared in a meeting with the project team & develop Google Form. Through the Google Form, the Youth Council members study with 120 boys and girls. Consolidated received feedback on the benefits and challenges of the project. Recommendation: Digital literacy, organizing meetings with parents, changing the meeting time and place of girls

Project 3 – Girls led advocacy for increased access to education

Objective - By September 2024, Ms. Sangita Beniwal, Chairperson, RSCPCR, will issue notification for activating District level Redressal Mechanisms under RTE Forum across the state. This will benefit overall 9977083 students enrolled in Govt. schools including 5043540 Girls.

Outcomes:

- To build leadership capacity of 280 girls to raise awareness on girl child education, provision of free education and redressal mechanism in third quarter (May 2024) of the project implementation.
- By October 2024, the effective mechanism of RTE rules at Schools through Girls participation in SMC/SDMCs.
- By November 2024, Promoting active participation RTE forum & Grievance Redressal Committee members.

Key Achievements:

Organize monthly meetings with girl leaders of Meena Manch to discuss life skills and education: 72 meetings organized on No Bag Day in 14 school with 210 Meena and 140 Gargi Manch girls. Session



delivered on life skills education and other issues as: school enrollment, cleanliness, mid-day meal. Girls are happy to learn something new by discussing these issues during the meetings.

Quarterly meeting for Strengthening SMC/SDMC members on RTE norm: School Management Committee meetings on Amavasya day on 2 July with 180 participants and on 8 November with 210 participants. During the meeting, information and progress of the project was shared and the inclusion of girls of Meena and Gargi Manch in the School Development Plan (SDP) and school problems were discussed and the School Management Committee has taken the problems of the school into consideration.



Participated in SMC/SDMC Training in Cluster Level: For effective implementation of RTE norms, a cluster-level training programme for SMC/SDMC members with 165 members trained at five locations at Government Higher Secondary School level in the months of August-September. The training covered key aspects including information about the project, main provisions of the RTE Act 2009, objectives of RTE and responsibilities of schools and teachers under the RTE Act 2009.

Organizing quarterly meetings regarding sensitization with teacher training cell and Resource person: Quarterly meetings with resource persons for teacher training were held in the months of May, August, September with 20 participants. During the meetings, the progress of the project was shared, and the resource persons were informed about the problems faced by girls in schools. The resource persons assured that all problems would be resolved, and the participation of girls in school development plans would be ensured.

Meeting with Rajasthan State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (RSCPCR): On 2 May 2024, 5 September, 18 September, 21 October, 20 November, Project Director Dr. Shivji Ram Yadav and Project Officer Poonam Jonwal organized a meeting with RSCPCR members at the state level and shared the information of the project and discussed to activate the grievance redressal mechanism under the Right to Free and Compulsory Education 2009 in the entire state and gave a letter in writing on which RSCPCR agreed and passed an order on 16 November to activate the grievance redressal mechanism under the Right to Free and Compulsory Education 2009 in the entire state.

Organize two days training on , Role of Girls in SMC, School development Plan, Redressal mechanisms ,Structure and function of RSCPCR- A two-day training organized at school level with 345 (216 male and 129 female) SMC members in the months of May, June and July. In which the members were given detailed information on the purpose of SMC formation, the structural structure of SMC, the process of selection of members, meeting process, their work role, complaint redressal mechanism, Rajasthan State Child Rights Protection Commission.



Quarterly meeting/dialogue with RTE redressal committee- Quarterly meetings of the Grievance Redressal Committee were organized in which a total of 73 participants attended the meetings in



the months of May, June, August, September and November. During this period, school level challenges were placed before the Grievance Redressal Committee through quarterly meetings.

Capacity Building training of RTE member at District/Block level- Capacity building training of RTE members at district level On October 15, a one-day workshop was organized with 28 members at the district level. All the education officers of the district and blocks participated in it and all the education officers of the district became aware of the efforts being made in the project and agreed to activate the grievance redressal mechanism in the district and prompt resolution of complaints.



Meeting with RTE forum at State level for effective implementation of RTE norm in state-

02 State level Meet in June and December with the RTE Forum and Rajasthan State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, in which information

about the project was shared and discussions were held to activate the grievance redressal mechanism under the Right to Free and Compulsory Education Act 2009 in the entire state.

Project Dissemination Workshop- Project dissemination workshop was organized on 9 December with 50 participants. During this, while informing about the project, the progress of the activities done throughout the year was shared and the future action plan was discussed.

Project 4 - The Pilot Education Initiative Supported by WSUS

The Pilot Education Initiative titled “Girls to complete secondary school and have the skills necessary to negotiate key life decisions” is being implemented in Phalodi, Western Rajasthan from October 2023. This intervention aims to encourage more girls to enroll in schools and stay in school until completion of their secondary education and through Life Skills Education, involve parents and communities in promoting the importance of girl child education and Vocational Skills for employability.

The initiative aims to engage at least 1000 girls, where the core focus will be the Transition from secondary school to college and learning a vocational skill for employability and empowerment.

Activiety :

Academic Mentorship Program: The Academic Mentorship Program was initiated with aim to assist Class twelfth girls from four Higher Secondary schools in Phalodi, Rajasthan in preparation for their board exams. Discuss: Selection of students 2. Identification and training of mentors 3. Academic workshops and seminars- 4. Continuous monitoring and assessment. as a Result of this Activity All Class 12 results from the Academic Mentorship Program have been excellent as all 96 girls graduated to secondary School to college successfully.





Special Day Celebration: knowledge and create a positive environment which are as follows-

Menstruation Hygiene Day: The World Menstrual Hygiene celebrated in baap office with 52 participants on 28 May. Through this activity, we achieve the following objectives: -To promote menstrual hygiene management (MHM) among adolescent girls and women. - To increase awareness and acceptance of menstrual hygiene practices. -To provide a supportive environment for open discussion about menstruation.

World No Tobacco Day: On May 31, poster making and slogan writing was organised with 39 participants in the project area with the aim of educate students about the harmful effects of tobacco and raise community awareness about protecting children from tobacco industry interference.

World Environment Day: Environment Day was celebrated at WIN Centre with 28 participants and awareness was raised about environmental issues through painting. Promoting environmental conservation among the younger generation was discussed.

Quarterly meeting cum capacity building training for peer leaders: Quarterly meeting cum capacity building training for peer leaders was conducted on 28th May, 16th August and 28th October with the aim to review progress and set goals for the next quarter, provide opportunities to colleagues to learn and improve leadership skills, resolve problems, empower decision making and understand challenges, foster trust and a shared sense of purpose within the team.

Women Serve's storytelling visit: On 26 June Dr. Nioma, Arijit, Manish, Dhruv, Nidhi, Harshali, and members of the SSSR program team, along with several interviewees. Interviews were conducted with top graduates Tanu Paliwal, peer leader Ms. Chanchal Khorwal and Ms. Harshali Zalke, Program Manager, SSSR, focusing on their educational experiences and achievements in capacity building.

Participation of Girls and Boys in District-Level Tournament- A district-level sports tournament was organized in which five schools, including Baap, Badi Sid, Kan Singh Ki Sid, Gadna, and Nayagaon, participated. The events were hosted at various venues such as Nokha, Kanasar, Dhechu, and Lohawat.

Completion of Beautician Course at Wings to Fly Center- A three-month beautician course was successfully completed at the Wings to Fly (WIN) Center for 15 girls. This course was designed to equip participants with essential beauty skills as part of the WIN Center's mission to enable young women to "Learn to Earn."

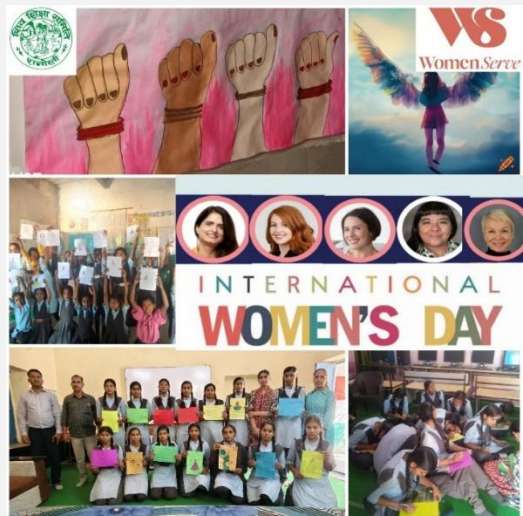
Staff capacity building training on Project Implementation Plan: The objectives of the training were multi-faceted, emphasizing the empowerment of staff with essential skills, knowledge, and expertise vital for project success. It aimed to enhance proficiency in planning, execution, monitoring, and evaluation processes while fostering adaptability and flexibility among the project teams. 15 Member were be Participated in this Training.



Quarterly Meetings cum Capacity Building Training with Peer Leaders: SSSR organized a quarterly meeting to ensure regular communication and collaboration among peer leaders.

Reviewing Past Progress: During the meeting, SSSR conducted a comprehensive review of the past three months' progress and achievements. Peer leaders presented their reports, highlighting key milestones, challenges encountered, and lessons learned.

Planning for the Next Quarter: Based on the review of past progress, SSSR collaboratively developed a quarterly plan for the upcoming period. This plan outlined specific activities, timelines, and objectives to be achieved, ensuring alignment with the overall goals of the program.



Special Day celebration:

Celebrated International Girls Child Day on 11th October 2024: 67 girls participated in this Activity and Creative posters and charts showcasing visions for girls' empowerment. During this Activity Encouraged girls to share their aspirations and break social barriers.

National Girls Child Day and Women's Day: A total of 80 participants took part in the celebration across 5 schools and the WIN Centre and Actively Participate in Drawing and Other Activity. Baseline Survey in Five Intervention School:

Key Interventions and Activities:

Structured Surveys & Questionnaires: Collected data on student demographics, school facilities, and teacher availability. Student & Teacher Interviews: Gathered insights on learning gaps, challenges, and support needs.

Infrastructure Assessment: Evaluated the availability of classrooms, libraries, sanitation facilities, and digital learning tools.

Bakery Course at "Wings to Fly" Academic Centre: During this quarter, significant progress was made in establishing and implementing vocational courses at the Wings to Fly Academic Centre. Bakery Course, which aimed at fostering employability, skill development, and economic empowerment among young women. This initiative proved 13 participants with hands-on training in baking techniques, entrepreneurship skills, and market readiness, ensuring they gain practical experience for future opportunities.





Life Skills Session / Academic Mentorship Program: A total of 75 life skills sessions were conducted by trained peer leaders across 5 government girls' schools. These sessions were organized monthly, focusing on relevant and age-appropriate life skill themes.

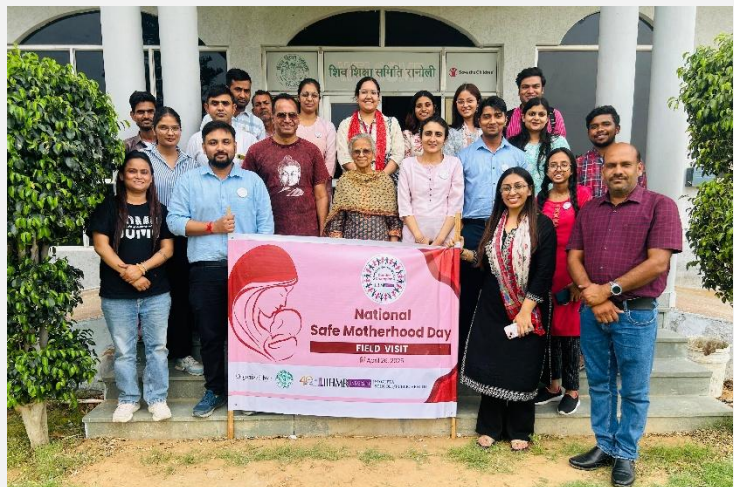

The Strengthening of Women & Girls Federation Initiative in Rajasthan is being implemented in 25 villages of Phalodi and Jodhpur from October 2023. This intervention aims to enhance the Strengthening of Women & Girls Federation for entrepreneurship and leadership development through education in Jodhpur, Western Rajasthan, with a targeted completion by March 2025.

The major focus of the intervention is on Strengthening of Women & Girls Federation. The initiative aims to engage the 800 Women from 70 SHG and Adolescents, where the core focus will be the 800 women and 300 Adolescents .

Under the initiative, SHG Women and adolescents will be equipped with skill training, Capacity building and knowledge and linkages with Govt. schemes benefits for enhance livelihood option. This will encourage 300 adolescents' girls and 25 VDC Village development committee to continue their confidence and skill and also develop awareness in the community towards the importance of livelihood and integrated development.

The program has been integrated with other on-going WSUS initiatives (Education, Wash, Livelihood, Economic Empowerment, etc.) through adopting a cluster approach, and linking them to existing government programs and schemes to make a larger impact on the quality of life of rural desert communities.

They have skilled on repairing of mobile and also saying and committed for working with any local mobile shop for practical knowledge and after some time working with other person then will be establish her shop in area.

Project: 2 Milk Producer Women Awareness

Project introduction- SSSR working with Ujala Milk Producer Company 03 Districts of Kota division, Kota, Baran and Jhalawar. As the name suggests the company deals in milk. The company has opened Milk Collection Centre in selected villages of all these districts. Taking milk from the milk producer members of the village, works to sell it in Mother Dairy. Some percentage of the annual profit is distributed among the members. The company has received financial support from Rajeevika.

Objective & Goal – To make women milk producer’s members of Ujalaa Dairy, so that milk producers can get proper benefits of milk

Main activities – One day training program with women milk production members and potential members. We organized 3 trainings at each milk pulling center (MPP), which are as follows-



1. **Milk Producer Awareness Program (PAP)**- Orient families specially women about the program and Ujala Milk Producer Company and the process of becoming a member of Ujala, member's terms, conditions, responsibilities, benefits, right price of cow and buffalo milk according to fat and transparent and fair milk collection system etc.
2. **Good Quality and Clean Milk Production Awareness Program (QCMP)**- women members of Milk Pulling Center (MPP) are given training on good quality and clean milk. As- 1. Clean and healthy animals 2. Clean place 3. Clean drinking water 4. Clean stainless-steel utensils 5. Wash hands with soap before milking. 6. Wash udder and dry it with clean cloth. 7. Remove first udder separately before milking. 8. Clean milkers. 9. Feed green fodder during milking. 10. Dip in bactericidal solution or on them 11. Cover the milk and take it to the collection center as soon as possible 12. Clean milk collection center and Balanced diet should be given to animals so that the quality of milk increases.
3. **Women awareness program (WAP) – Training of women for membership condition** and selection of helpers at MPP only women. The payment direct received in the account of women 3 times in a month. Artificial insemination and pregnancy test facility, Heifer registration, Animal infertility prevention camp, Imbalance in diet balance program, Disadvantages of diet and benefits of adopting diet balance program, Silage or green fodder pickle demonstration, Thanela testing facility, Ujala pelleted cattle feed, Information is given about Ujala region special chelated mineral mixture etc.

Women Empowerment Theme:

Project- Mahila SALAH Evm SURKSHA Kendra PS Niwai District Tonk – Support Women Empowerment Department Tonk at Police Station Niwai in Tonk

The objectives set forth for the MSSK are as follows:-

(i) Providing support to women facing violence by way of:

- Assisting them to negotiate their way through the Criminal Justice System.
- Settling disputes through alternative dispute resolution mechanisms.
- Providing rehabilitation to women survivors of violence.

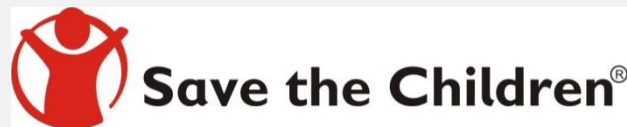


Figure 1 ARAVALI RAJASTHAN
